Our course is showing good signs with the winter grass beginning to show a nice green across the fairways. It is certainly nice to hit off when you able to find the fairway. Nigel has been spraying and doing maintenance on the greens which will recover quickly.

Rakes & Flagsticks

The Club has reviewed its policy on the use of rakes in the bunkers and the removal of flagsticks. Rakes will be returned to the bunkers and flagsticks may be removed under the following conditions.

A player who is required to rake the bunker or wishes the flag to be removed must do so by using a towel or glove [or similar].

This is a suggested guideline from Golf Australia which we are willing to trial at this stage of the Pandemic.

A reminder that the flagstick does not have to be removed when putting.

It is extremely important to note that COVID- 19 virus may be passed on by touching the surfaces which have been touched by a person who is infected by the virus.

The Club encourages players to carry their own santiser for use if one of these two situations occurs during your round of golf.

These changes will be monitored and if players do not follow the Club's advice then a return to the previous system will be implemented.

PLEASE look after your fellow golfer and the club by doing the right thing. Small bottles of sanitiser are available at the club for \$0.50 or in our local shops for maybe a dollar. Thank you.

The fairway scarifier we have purchased has arrived from Metroturf Machinery, Gembrook, thanks to Tim Magee, the manager, delivering it personally. A long journey but well worth the trip we believe. It wouldn't be possible without a generous contribution from the Gerries who provided \$3000 towards

the ten-thousand-dollar machine. The Gerries are very supportive of any aspect which will improve our golf course and they see this project as very worthwhile.

The machine is towed behind the tractor and the fairway is scarified with the grass collected in the trailor bin. The grass is able to be transplanted and



hopefully grow in areas where the grass is required. The work can be best done through the growing period of our summer grasses so we won't see the real benefits until 2022 summer/autumn period. Both our Grounds chairman, Fred George, & Greens keeper, Nigel Zanker, are keen to put it to work.
